2016 IMPACT REPORT



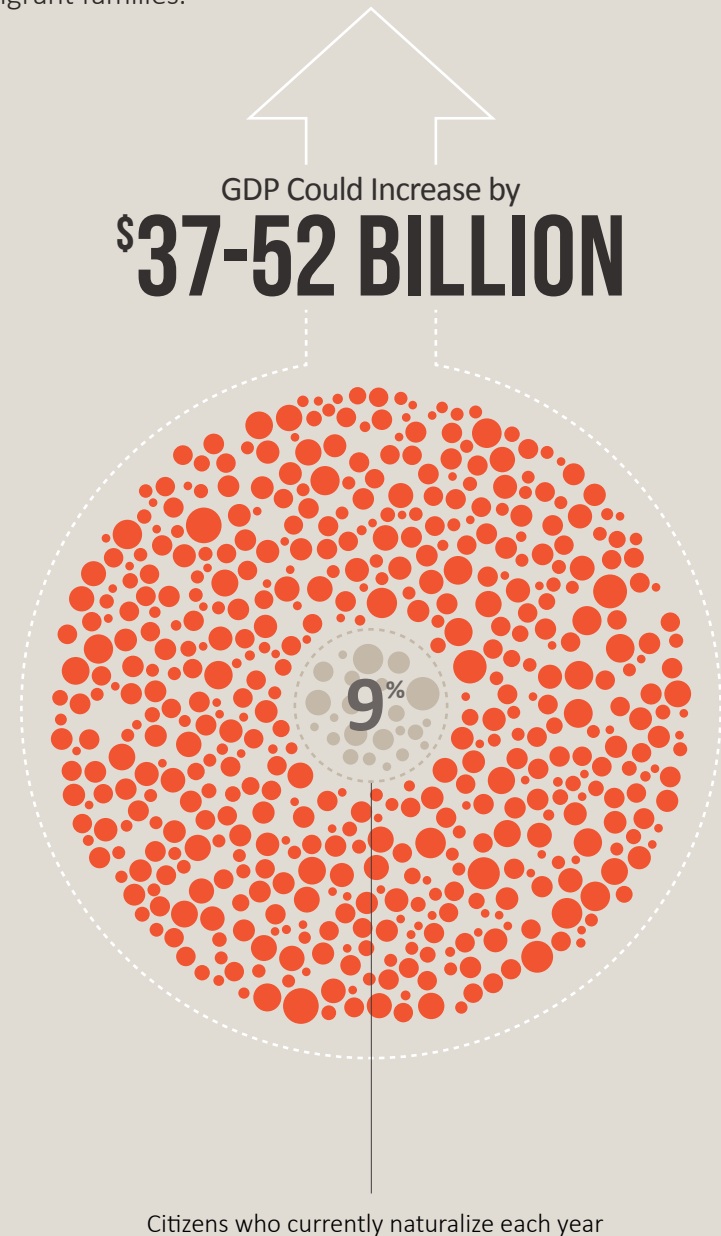
Cities for Citizenship (C4C) is a major bipartisan national initiative to increase citizenship among eligible U.S. permanent residents and encourage cities across the country to invest in citizenship programs. C4C is premised on the idea that when municipal leaders develop and fund naturalization efforts to encourage and support eligible residents in applying for US citizenship, it produces substantial economic and civic benefits for all of their constituents.

Founded in 2014, 38 cities and counties have joined C4C, which is chaired by New York City Mayor Bill de Blasio, Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel and Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti, with support from the Center for Popular Democracy and the National Partnership for New Americans. 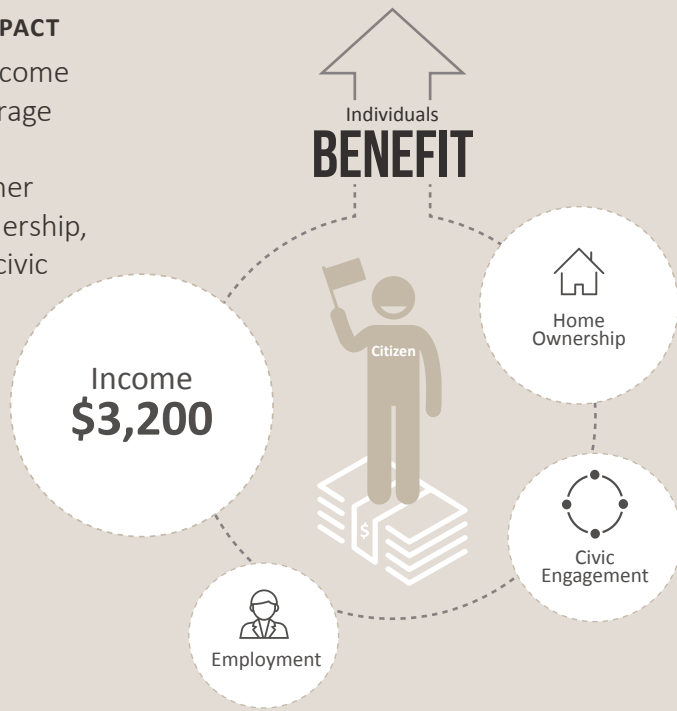
THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF CITIZENSHIP

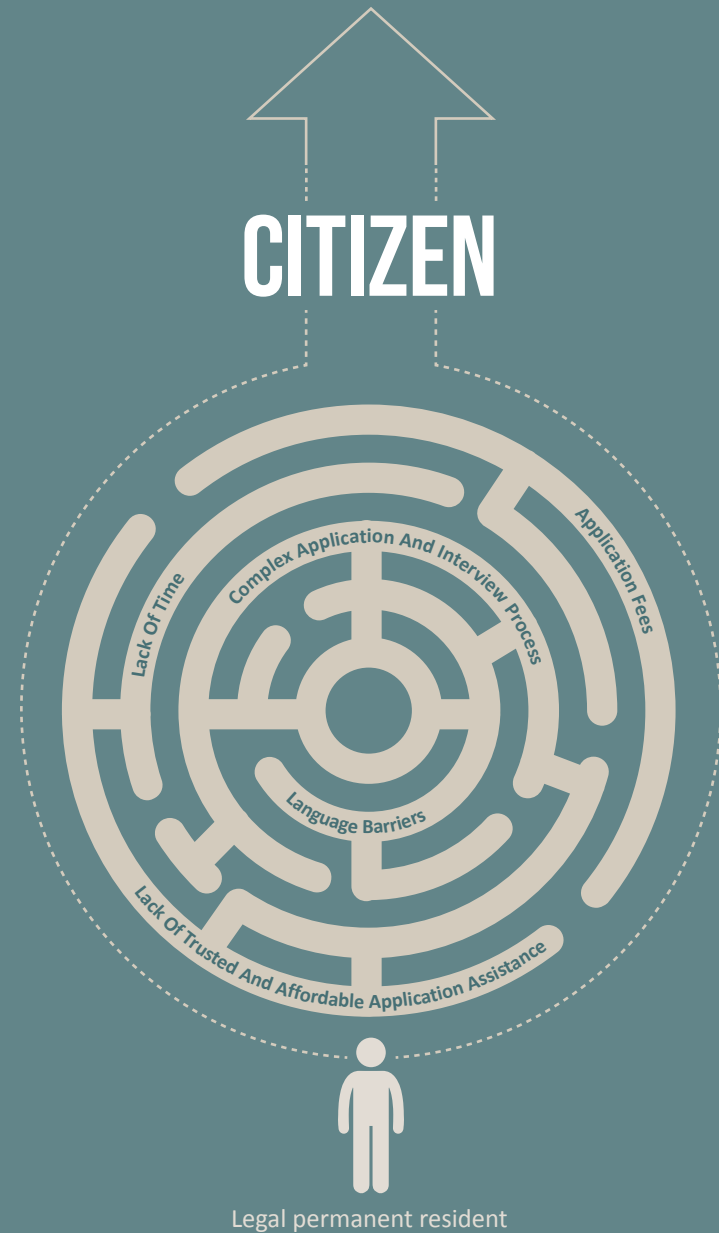
THE INDIVIDUAL IMPACT

Individuals who become citizens see an average income increase of \$3,200, and higher rates of home ownership, employment, and civic engagement.



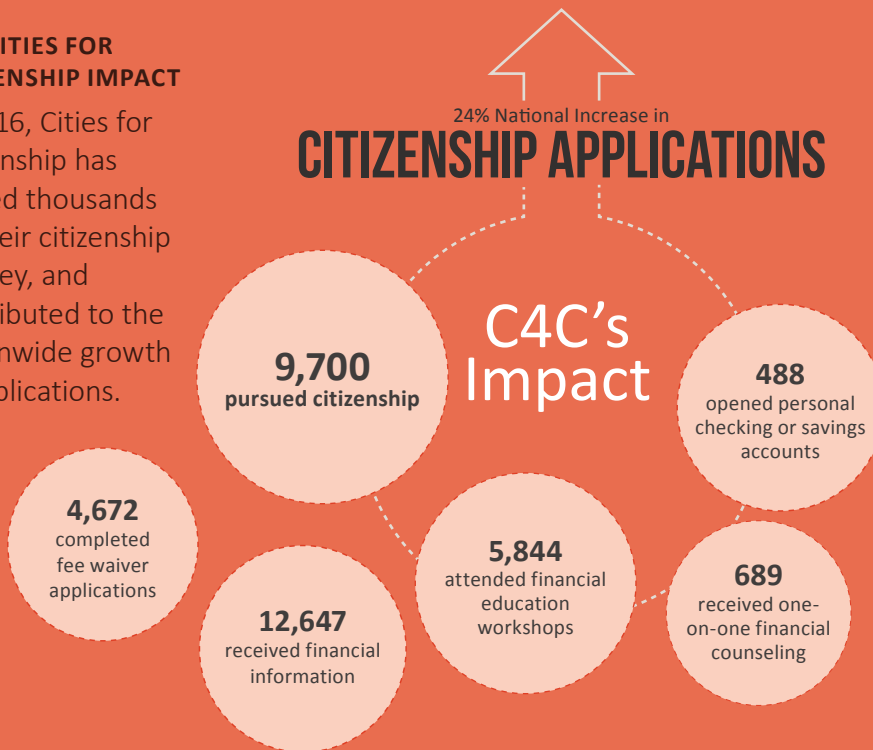

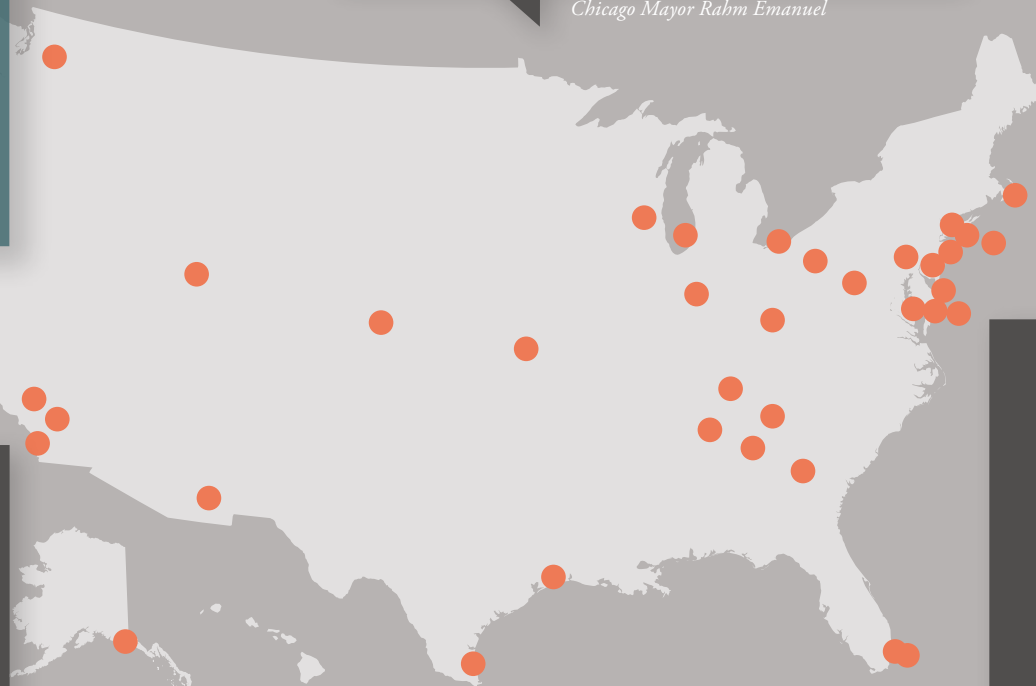
